Diane Hill, 2415 Bent Trail, Trails of Mansfield Subdivision, Mansfield, asked the Council for assistance regarding dirt bikes being ridden in the yards next to them and the creek area behind their property. Ms. Hill stated as a parent she is concerned about the safety of the children riding the bikes. She stated over the past 2-1/2 years they have tried to talk with their neighbors, the HOA is unable to help and the Police Department is only able to talk to the parents. She commented on the bikes becoming louder and more numerous, the noise, disturbing the peace and riding the dirt bikes in and around housing areas being an issue of safety and liability. Ms. Hill stated someone needs to look into the issues of safety and liability if the dirt bikes and/or ATVs are allowed to continue being ridden on the property. Ms. Hill stated she provided a 30 second video to the city secretary of an occurrence that happened last Saturday of the noise of 2 bigger bikes and 2 smaller ones. Mayor Cook asked Ms. Hill to discuss the issue further with Chief of Police Gary Fowler who was in attendance at the meeting and give him a copy of the information.

Brandon McKinley, Chesapeake Energy, 1000 Energy Way, Fort Worth, stated he would defer his comments regarding the changes to landscaping, screening requirements and waivers for oil and gas sites to Norman Herrera.

Norman Herrera, Chesapeake Energy, 1000 Energy Way, Fort Worth, spoke in regards to New Business agenda item 09-1529. Mr. Herrera stated Chesapeake is one of the operators in Mansfield and cares about aesthetics and quality of life. He stated Chesapeake is asking for operator input during the process, the ability of having flexibility on site specific requirements, and the ability of having the burden placed on the landlord to notify the tenants.
